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Many local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people contribute to Australian society through music, art, culture, community, education, environment, sport, employment and politics.

If you think that someone in your community deserves to be recognised for their contribution, then complete this form and tell us why you are nominating them for a 2018 NAIDOC Award.

Guidelines for Eligibility:

All people nominated for a 2018 NAIDOC Award must:

- Be of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent; and
- Identify as an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander; and
- Provide evidence of descent; and
- Be accepted as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander by an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander community; and
- Be available to attend the Gala Ball on 14th July 2018.

Nomination Category Guidelines:

- Apprentice or Trainee of The Year must have held current position for a minimum of 3 months.
- Sportsperson of the Year must be signed to a specific code of sport within the region or state.
- Youth of the Year must be aged between 16-25 years old and can be male or female.
- Artist of the Year category includes visual, performing arts, dance and music.
- Elder of the Year (male or female) must be aged over 60 years to qualify.
- Scholar of the Year can be male or female currently studying at a tertiary level.
- Person of the Year (male or female) must be an active member of community.
- Inspirational Woman is open to indigenous women who have made a significant contribution to the community, or individuals that can demonstrate positive change under the 2018 National NAIDOC theme "Because Of Her We Can".

People who have previously won a NAIDOC Award through the Bundaberg and District region are ineligible to be nominated in the same category.

Nominations received will be shortlisted and two from each category will be selected by a committee comprised of NAIDOC committee members and community Elders.

Nomination tips:

- Give reasons for your nomination
- Write about the nominee's particular position, role, job or work that they have done for the community
- How long have you known the nominee and in what capacity?
- The positive qualities of the nominee that makes them a suitable candidate for the award (including accomplishments and abilities)
- Try to be specific as possible

For the nomination to be accepted you must:

- Provide full contact details for you and the person you are nominating; and
- Tell us as much as you can about the person on this nomination form (attach any extra information)
