Shell's QGC project is one of Australia's leading natural gas producers, focused on developing Queensland's world-class onshore natural gas reserves and is based on Curtis Island, off the coast of Gladstone.

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN ABOUT

There are multiple traineeships available which will provide coaching to develop skills in safety, teamwork, exposure to mechanical and electrical teams and activities, and assist in the delivery of maintenance scheduling at an LNG plant.

The traineeships will be a mix of hands-on practical experience, as well as some classroom lessons. Most of the traineeship will be carried out on Curtis Island with the classroom experience to be held in Gladstone.

This is a great opportunity for successful candidates to receive training in a dynamic and challenging environment where our Goal Zero safety target will ensure safe delivery of our production targets.

You will be learning from experienced LNG professionals first hand, helping you to jump start your career in the natural gas industry. Your study will count towards a Certificate II in Engineering Production.
